**Parsa Barari** is a student at Anderson CVI in Whitby and has been playing violin for 7 years, and in LJYO for 3 years. He has selected *Czardas*, a Hungarian dance by Monti. He explains that it showcases versatility of the player as the music changes from slow and thoughtful to quick and poignant.

**Sidney Gallimore** has selected *Praeludium and Allegro* by Kreisler, and states that she loves the contrast between the lyrical sections and the fast and challenging sections. Although it was written in 1905, the style is from an earlier period to pay homage to the masters such as Bach and Vivaldi. She has been studying violin for 10 years, and also plays piano. Sidney is a homeschooled student in grade 9.





Ardian Gragjevi is a grade 10 student at All Saints Catholic Secondary School and has been playing violin for 10 years, and was excited to find the *Concerto for Two Violins* by Vivaldi for him to play with his sister. The lush and full string sound that Vivaldi is known for comes through in this less familiar piece. Ardian has been in LIYO for 5 years and appreciates the skills he has learned here and in Ajax-Pickering's Music4Life strings and the Mooredale Youth Orchestra.

**Era Gragjevi** is also at All Saints CSS and in grade 8. In the school band she plays trombone and cites the motivation from LJYO to help her practice and improve her sight-reading skills for various instruments. Era enjoys all things creative in the Arts and Media program at school and believes that being siblings helps their styles blend in this duet, *Concerto for Two Violins*.





**Joshua Mostert** is a multi-faceted musician, playing piano for 11 years, violin for 6 years, and upright bass, viola, and guitar. He proposed Bach's *Toccata and Fugue in D minor* to take advantage of the gorgeous pipe organ built into Port Hope United Church, and it is a unique opportunity for the orchestra musicians to learn to play along with a soloist on keyboard. He especially thanks PHUC music director David Sawicki for allowing use of the organ for this concert.

**Sam Ninan** is another student from All Saints CSS in Whitby specializing in instrumental music on violin. He chose *Meditation* from Massenet's opera "Thaïs" because of the complexity of emotions it shows and has been working hard on perfecting the dynamics and rhythmic patterns. He recently participated in the orchestra for the Oshawa Little Theatre's production of "The Sound of Music".





**Kristen Woodward** has been studying violin for almost 12 years and is thrilled to present the third movement of Vivaldi's *Four Seasons—Summer Concerto*. She has loved this piece since dancing to it as a competitive dancer with Premiere Dance. Kristen also plays guitar and piano when she has time away from homework as a grade 9 student at Cobourg CVI and is grateful for the opportunity to return as a soloist with LJYO.

**Emily Yourt** has been studying flute for 7 years, and appreciates the mentorship of her cousin Ray, LJYO alumnus and coach, and his support for this duet. Emily selected this duet *Andante et Rondo*, originally written by Franz Doppler to perform with his brother, stating she loves how the rich tones of the flute resonate in Port Hope United Church, which was built in 1875 only 5 years after the piece was written.


#### **BILL BODDINGTON BURSARY**
